ORDER MADE AFTER APPLICATION

ON THE APPLICATION of the College of Physicians and Surgeons of British Columbia (the “College”), coming on for hearing at Vancouver, British Columbia, on 18 January 2019, and on hearing Brent Olthuis and Trevor Bant, counsel for the College, and Simon Adams, counsel for the respondent Rajdeep Kaur Khakh (“Ms Khakh”):

THIS COURT ORDERS that:

1. BY CONSENT, Ms Khakh is held in civil contempt of subparagraphs 1(a) and (d) of the consent order pronounced in this matter on 22 March 2018 (the “Consent Order”) for having, on 3 July 2018:
 - (a) held herself out to Aleks Mikolajczyk as being qualified, able and willing to provide injections of dermal fillers;

- (b) supplied an apparatus or appliance for the administration of dermal fillers to Ms Mikolajczyk; and,
 - (c) administered injections of dermal fillers to Ms Mikolajczyk.
- 2. Ms Khakh is sentenced to be incarcerated for 30 days which is suspended and to be served only if Ms Khakh is found to have committed a further breach of the Consent Order within two years of the pronouncement of the instant order.
- 3. Ms Khakh is sentenced to two years' probation. The terms of Ms Khakh's probation are the following:
 - (a) Ms Khakh shall keep the peace and be of good behaviour;
 - (b) Ms Khakh shall report to the Abbotsford Community Corrections probation office at 2865 Cruickshank Street, Abbotsford, British Columbia, within 72 hours after being served with an entered copy of the instant order and thereafter shall report as directed by her supervisor, but no less frequently than once per week by telephone;
 - (c) Ms Khakh shall, on her first day of reporting to the probation office, provide her supervisor with her current address and other contact information and, thereafter, shall advise her supervisor of any changes in her address or other contact information; and,
 - (d) Ms Khakh shall, on her first day of reporting to the probation office, provide her supervisor with an entered copy of the instant order.
- 4. Ms Khakh shall forthwith pay \$300 to the College, upon receipt of which the College shall remit the \$300 to Ms Mikolajczyk.
- 5. Within 14 days after this order is pronounced, Ms Khakh shall pay a fine of \$4,700 for her contempt.

6. BY CONSENT, Ms Khakh shall pay to the College its costs of this application as special costs, including all disbursements.


